OPEN DAY 2015

The KDU Open Day was held on 03rd October 2015 from 0800 hrs to 1700 hrs at KDU premises for the second consecutive year. The event was organized to provide an opportunity for prospective students and their families to visit the university and learn about its degree porgrammes.

The Faculty of Management, Social Sciences and Humanities (FMSH) had also arranged four information stalls to provide information about degree programmes and other academic courses offered by the Department of Management and Finance, Department of Social Sciences, and Department of Languages.

In addition to providing information to the visitors, the faculty launched its inaugural 'Newsletter' as one of the main highlights among the Open Day events of the University. Moreover, the three departments of the faculty organized a game zone for the visitors, which comprised of thrilling entertainment and learning games.



CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE: PORTS AND THE WAY FORWARD

The Department of Management and Finance of the Faculty of Management, Social Sciences and Humanities organized a workshop on the theme of 'Challenges and Opportunities in International Trade: Ports and the Way Forward'. It was held on 23rd October 2015 from 0830 hrs to 1630 hrs at the auditorium of the Faculty of Graduate Studies. The Objectives of the workshop were as follows:

- (i) Imparting professional knowledge on the field of International Trade among professionals in the field.
- (ii) Creating a platform for networking of professionals and academia in the field of International Trade.
- (iii) Exploring challenges and opportunities in the field of International Trade and finding strategic approaches to overcome those challenges.

There were around sixty participants from various institutions including the Sri Lanka Army, Sri Lanka Navy, Sri Lanka Export Development Board, CINEC Maritime Campus, Colombo Dockyard, Ocean University, Prasanna Management Consultants, University of Peradeniya, Sabaragamuwa University, McLarens Logistics and Richardson Projects.









ENTREPRENEURSHIP EXHIBITION

The concept of an Entrepreneurship Exhibition was developed to evaluate the undergraduates' creativity and innovation skills in developing a business. For the first time in the history of KDU, students of Intake 30 in Logistics Management and Management & Technical Sciences have developed a new business idea and exhibit it in an event called "KDU Young Entrepreneurs 2014". A panel of four judges were invited to evaluate students' effort and select the best business idea. Finally, a complete business plan was prepared based on the idea exhibited.

Students of Intake 31 organized the second business plan exhibition named 'KDU Young Entrepreneurs 2015' on 23rd of October, 2015. The plan and the procedure were well organized and all the students were assigned the task as an assignment at the beginning of the semester with a sample of a detailed business plan. They were given deadlines and a work schedule to submit sections of the business plan. Thus, the students were able to receive much benefit out of this for duly completed sections enabled them to go for quality work with continuous improvements. DISASTER MANAGEMENT POSTER | EXHIBITION

A Disaster Management poster exhibition was held at the academic building-KDU, on 23rd Oct 2015. Students of intake 32 in Logistics Management and Management & Technical Sciences were given a list of disasters identified by the Disaster Management Centre of Sri Lanka and were asked to develop mitigation measurements to reduce future risks of those disasters. Each student group was supposed to select one disaster and present related mitigation measurements at a given date using posters.

Students were given the following tasks to complete and present in a $4' \times 3'$ poster.

- 1. A small description of disaster Impact strength, deaths, property damage etc
- 2. An analysis of potential vulnerability
- 3. Common mitigation practices available in the context Structural and Non-structural
- 4. Suggestions and ideas on mitigation
- 5. Recommendations to apply common and new mitigation strategies to Sri Lanka

Ten groups from Logistics Management and 05 groups from Management and Technical Sciences presented on 15 different disasters occurring in Sri Lanka. The Possible mitigation practices on landslides, droughts, floods, Tsunami, chemical disasters, Explosure, Epidemics, Earthquicks and Civil Conflicts were presented. The lecturer- In-Charge of this exhibition is Ms Kalpana Ambepitiya.







ESPLENDIDO '15 - TALENT SHOW

ESPLENDIDO '15, a masterpiece organized by the Intake 31 students of Logistics, was a fantastic musical and dancing extravaganza held for the very first time in KDU history, at the BMICH on 18th September, 2015 from 4pm onwards. The objective of this talent competition was not only to search for raw talent in KDU but also to lend a hand to the Cancer Hospital by providing them with necessary medicine for cancer patients with the income generated through this project. The students who got selected through auditions performed head to head against one another in the grand finale in the presence of a crowd of nearly 1400. 








CASE STUDY TOUR OF INTAKE 31



On the 17th, an orientation to Maha Oya division was conducted at Maha Oya DS office. The programme on the 18th was at the Pollebadda Grama Niladhari Division where nearly five hundred indigenous families live. It was organized in order to allow the students to learn how to step into an unfamiliar environment, build rapport with the local community, use everyday conversation as an interview technique, conduct informal observation of activities, record observations in field notes (chronologically) and use both tacit and explicit information in analyzing problems. The final day of the case study tour was spent at the Special Forces Camp – Maduru Oya.

The Department of Social Sciences acknowledge the enormous support extended by the VC, DVC (Defence & Administration), DVC (Academic), Dean (FDSS), Dean (FMSH), Mr. Mangala Wickramasinghe (former DS- Maha Oya), DS, ADS and other officers of the DS office – Maha Oya, Principal and the staff of Pollebadda school, Pollebadda villagers, C/O Maduru Oya SF camp, C/O 3 VIR and C/O 3 WC of Sandunpura and their staff in making this case study tour a success.







HEALTH CAMP 2015

The students of Intake 31 of the Department of Social Sciences of General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University organized a Health Camp for the non-academic staff of the university and their families on the 7th of December 2015 at the Faculty of Medicine of the university premises from 8.30 am to 4.00 pm. This was organized as a partial fulfillment of their 4th semester module on Project Management.

The first part of the health camp was general screening and specialist-consultancy service. More than 350 non-academic staff and their family members visited the health camp. Around 20 medical doctors including the KDU Medical Faculty graduated doctors who recently completed their intern joined hands in the general screening. Specialist consultancy service was provided by our own doctors from the Faculty of Medicine, KDU. FAHS provided final year nursing students to assist the doctors, pharmacy lecturers and students to run a pharmacy and lecturers from the Department of Physiotherapy to run a physiotherapy unit during the health camp. Further to this, Sethsarana, Aurvedic Care, Link Sudantha – Dental Care and Apeksha – Fertility Care provided free services on this day.

An educative session was conducted towards the evening while a series of lectures on common diseases, identification and prevention methods was delivered by the Medical Faculty staff and external resource persons.

THE FIELD VISIT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AND NATIONAL BUILDING AND RESEARCH ORGANIZATION (NBRO)- INTAKE 32

The students of Intake 32 of the Department of Social Sciences participated in a field visit as a practical study of their 2nd semester module on Climatology and Geomorphology. This visit took place on the 24th of July, 2015.

As the first phase of the programme, the students visited the Meteorology Department in Sri Lanka. Following a brief introduction to the Meteorological Department and their procedures and service, the first session based on weather and climate was conducted by Mr. S. Jayasekara, the Director of Forecasting and Decision Support Unit. In order to increase the clarity of the session, Mrs. P.S. Wijayarathne, Officer-in-charge of Radar Branch, demonstrated a live upper air observation by sending a pilot balloon with a GPS receiver while demonstrating their measuring equipment. Later, Mr. S. Jayasekara explained on 'Thunder and Lightning in Sri Lanka that generates a hazardous impact, especially during the inter-monsoon period of the country.

Visiting the National Building and Research Organization (NBRO) was the second phase of the programme. The three-hour session at the NBRO conducted by Mr. Clarense Perera, Mr. T. Rasarootan and Ms. T.H.E. Dulanjalee gave students an informative demonstration on landslides in general, the role of NBRO in identifying and minimizing risks of landslides, the process of landslide zonation mapping in Sri Lanka and the current projects implemented by the NBRO in order to make disaster management more effective and efficient in Sri Lanka.









WALK ORGANIZED BY WOMEN IN LOGISTICS...

WiLAT (Women in Logistics and Transport), the women's body of the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT), organized a walk with the objective of creating awareness and promoting gender diversity in the field of Logistics and Transport. The theme of the walk was 'Striking a Balance on Logistics and Transport'. The Walk was held on 05th September 2015 from 7.30 a.m. onwards. The Total length of the walk was around 5 km which started from the Independence Square. It continued along Maitland Place, Nelum Pokuna Road, Dharmapala Mawatha, CWW Kannangara Mawatha and back to the Independence Square. There were more than 400 participants from the University of Moratuwa, CINEC Maritime Campus, KDU, industries in the Logistics sector and general public while media coverage of the event was given by Eye Channel, Newspapers, Social media and CILT website.

KDU took part in the event with a group of students of Department of Management and Finance. The students of Intake 32 won the 1st place in the Treasure Hunt game by finely exhibiting their thinking and decision making capacities. A float, an aircraft, which was designed by KDU won the 3rd place in the float competition. This was a good opportunity to market the Logistics Management Degree and introduce students who are reading for their undergraduate degree to the industry.

Dr. Namali Sirisoma, Head of the Department of Management and Finance is an Executive Member of WiLAT Sri Lanka and she represented KDU in WiLAT and CILT activities. In addition, staff members of the Department, Mrs. Kalpana Ambepitiya, Mrs. Dilani Ratnajeewa and Ms. Danisha De Mel also took part in the event with the students.

COUNSELLING WORKSHOP FOR PROFESSIONALS



On a request made by the Sri Lanka Institute of Development Administration (SLIDA), KDU designed a Leadership and Competency Development Programme for Sri Lanka Administrative Service (SLAS) Cadets. The whole programme runs in five batches and each batch has one month of in-house training at KDU, and around 40 SLAS cadets are in one batch.

The Department of Languages contributes to this programme by designing and teaching the Communication Skills package of this programme. The Communication Skills package aims at developing English language competencies of SLAS cadets through contact sessions with a variety of activities, which encourage collective and participatory learning. The objective of this is to provide an opportunity to develop their confidence in using the language for both oral and written communication in their personal and professional lives.

The first batch started their training on 8th February 2016, and three batches have already completed their training at KDU. The feedback given by the participants indicate that the Communication Skills package is highly useful for their career advancement.
